



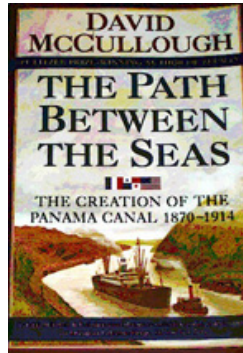

New Members

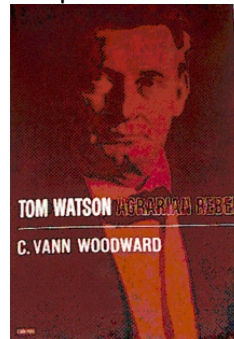

Many of you have asked over the past few weeks what the status of the new curriculum is - right now we're still in the public comment period that will go until about the middle of April. DOE is out on the road explaining everything during that period. Your curriculum director will have information on the meeting that your school's teacher team will be attending; however, I have copies of the Powerpoint shows that will be presented and will forward them to you on request. But I can assure you that unless there is a complete meltdown of the polar ice cap



between now and June, this new curriculum is going to be adopted in some form similar to what's being aired. We have our own folks following this process closely and as soon as we hear any news, you'll be the first to know.

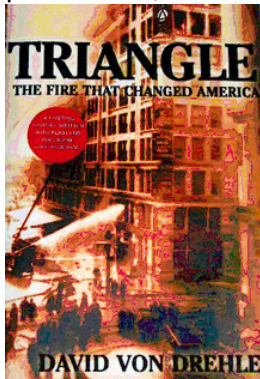

When asked that same question, Dr Lloyd Komatsu, the person that designed the tests stated: "I have no idea. Right now that's the plan, but call me tomorrow before you make any decisions." The good news is that after listening to Lloyd, I truly believe that the new tests will accurately measure the GPSs and that should be our primary concern. Books

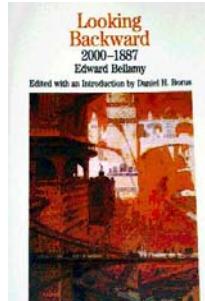

Editorial (Short, mis amigos!)

During my travels around South Georgia, I make it a point to ask the administrators and teachers I speak to what their take on the new curriculum is. So far, the results have been less than encouraging - I've found that about 90% of those folks haven't even read the portion of the new curriculum that will most affect them. That seems to be true from Superintendents down to classroom teachers - there seems to be an almost universal lack of concern and certainly very little appreciation of how radically things will change in many classrooms, especially if you're teaching US history. I have a Powerpoint show on this subject also (I use it to explain the impact to new teachers) that is also available on request (I'm saying that a lot). The people reading this letter have the advantage of SGHP and I would urge you to make sure that your administrators are not blindsided by the new requirements. The good news is that our teachers ARE savvy and their Principals are listening to them. It's a good feeling to be able to kick back and watch other folks scramble when you know that you've done your preparation and homework. Keep up the good work!
